South Africa	8 <sup>th</sup> African crop science society conference	Egypt	Insufficient time to process as the application was received within less than 2 months of the conference start date
Nigeria	New approach to breeding orphan crops of Africa	Switzerland	Poster presentation. The Kirkhouse Trust only considers applications from applicants invited to give oral presentations
Venezuela	Recent advances in banana crop protection and for sustainable production and improved livelihoods	South Africa	The conference over-subscribed, so the application had to be withdrawn
