**Kirkhouse Trust Conditions of Support:**

1. The focus of the research of scholarships supported by the Trust must relate to crop improvement and the research must be relevant to the student's country of origin.
2. The applicant will have been accepted by a PhD supervisor at an institution in the developing world.
3. The Trust will support MSc/PhD students for the period of study with a maintenance stipend recommended by the institution.
4. The applicant must be able to demonstrate that they will return to their country of origin once the MSc/PhD is complete. Evidence of secondment, study leave or employment after completion of post-graduate study must be provided.
5. It is Trust policy to fund only economy air travel costs on all the scholarships it funds.
